#### 4. Pick any one issue. Expand on how you will address it.

I want to work with the superior court judges to create a system that looks at whether the person is a public safety risk. When determined that a person does not pose a threat to the community, then they would be eligible for release on their recognizance. There is no reason to hold someone based on economics but public safety. The current system holds people based on their ability to pay.

#### 5. Suggest ways to jump-start the economy after COVID-19.

I would listen to the medical experts on what steps to take to reopen the economy. I would look at countries like New Zealand and how they are opening their economy. I would expand testing and surveillance to ensure that there are no hotspots that could ignite a second wave. We can only reopen the economy when it is safe, and we don't put lives at risk because if people don't feel safe, they will be unwilling to enter the market place.
