1. Why are you seeking your office?

New directives for working, worshiping, shopping, and dining out must be clear, simple, and consistent. Learn from essential businesses that have stayed open and remained virus-free (grocery stores, Home Depot, etc.) to determine optimal safeguards and adaptations.
